

Upholding the rights of people with disability training

Training overview

This training aims to increase participants' **understanding of the rights of people with disability** and improve their **skills** in considering **accessibility** in the **design and implementation of policy, projects and programs**. Key content covered includes: definitions and prevalence of disability, attitudes, behaviours and language, international and domestic legislative frameworks, accessibility and inclusion strategies and tools.

Learning outcomes

The key learning outcomes of the training are:

- increased understanding of disability and forms of discrimination that are experienced by people with disability
- increased understanding of the purpose and structure of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disability internationally and domestically
- increased awareness of community attitudes towards people with disability
- increased understanding of accessibility, barriers and support
- increased ability to apply inclusion strategies and tools.

What's included

The Commission is able to deliver the training in all capital cities and regional centres, as well as via webinar. The training package includes:

- facilitation from an experienced trainer
- provision of training rooms (if required)
- invitation and registration services
- light refreshments
- participant Handbook and other training materials.

Cost

Our standard *Upholding the rights of people with disability* training is delivered as a full-day training workshop. The cost of delivery is **\$5000 AUD + GST** for up to **20 participants**.
